




The County has an easy to use mapping tool available to anyone that wants to participate in the County's redistricting efforts.


What are communities of interest?



Communities of interest include ethnic and language minorities as well as other groups.

While communities of interest may include race, it cannot be the *predominant factor* in drawing district boundaries.

What IS NOT a community of interest?




political party affiliation

communities of interest that are county-wide


groups of similarly minded people who do no share geographic location

Important Questions to Ask




Does the community have a shared culture, characteristics or bond?

Important Questions to Ask




Is the community geographic in nature? Is the community able to be mapped? Are there are geographical boundaries?

Important Questions to Ask




What is the community's relationship with the jurisdiction being redistricted?




